A list for a binder was put together and shared with the board, the board agreed on the items listed. The binders will be put together and distributed on our next meeting

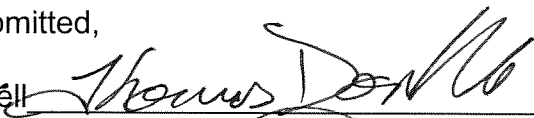

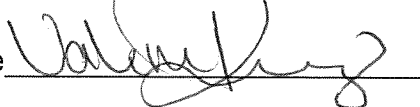

- It does not have to be “transit” specific – it can be for highways/roads as well.



Overview

- **RTD (Regional Transit District) in Denver is a transit agency spelled out in state law and is a version of an RTA.**

Citizen Transportation Advisory Board (CTAB) and Stormwater Board Onboarding Process

Within 5 days of a new member being appointed, they will receive:

- Phone call from the recording secretary welcoming them to the board and providing an overview of the onboarding process and details of the next meeting.
