Transportation Plan Update: Allison Baxter

1) Community Survey Report

- There was 667 responses. Other communities our size have received about 500
- Responses include City residents, business owners, work or student commuters
- Responders say that the most important thing to consider in transportation is time and distance
- Responders do not ride bicycles because of safety; sidewalks, traffic and intersections
- Responders would ride Transit if buses would be more frequent and faster routes

Capital Improvement Project Overview: Joel Hemesath

FASTER – Fund 320 (License plate registration) \$515,700.00

- Bridge Maintenance- upgrades rails to meet standards, patching of decks, and minor repairs
- Safety Improvement Design – Concept Improvement Plan for the intersection at 23rd Ave and 16th St
- 35th Ave & 8th St (Franklin) School Hawk Signal – Design and construction of pedestrian signal light
- Investment Charges

Keep Greeley Moving – Fund 321 (0.65% sale tax)

- Road Improvements – road widening of 35th Ave from 4th St to F St, and west 20th St and 71st Ave by King Soopers

- General Road maintenance: overlay & stripping, seal coat, patching, crack seal, pavement improvements, ADA ramps & sidewalks, and concrete repair – Alta Vista neighborhood by UNC, Bittersweet neighborhood, O St from 35th Ave to 17th Ave (overlay)
- Funding for the remainder of 2021 and 2022 is \$17,168,466.00
- Funding dependent on renewal in 2023 is \$54,552,052.00 for projects from 2023-2026

Transportation Development – Fund 334 (new construction plans pay a transportation fee)

- O St and 59th Ave Intersection improvement- The County is working with the City of Greeley to build a roundabout, the County will pay 25%. Out to bid in January and built in 2022
- 35th Ave road widening from 4th St to F St-Finishing landscaping in Spring of 2022
- 35th Ave and O St Roundabout-Realigning intersection improvement, this a county design and the City of Greeley will pay \$2 million. Construction will start this Fall and finish in the Spring
- 83rd Ave from 12th St to 10th St widening-Preliminary design this year and final design in 2022. A new traffic signal will be installed with turn lanes
- 10th St and 35th Ave intersection improvement- Conception design in 2022
- 35th Ave from F St to O St-Road widening to a 4-lane road to the north

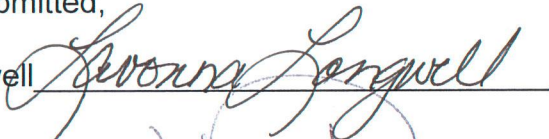
