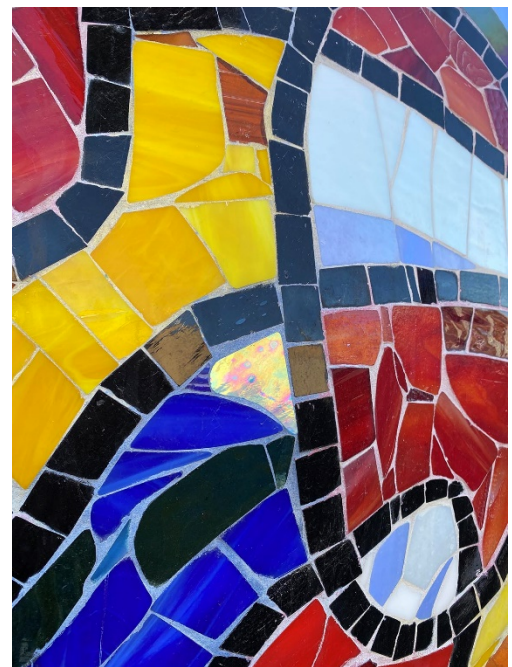
1. **Call to order**
2. **October Minutes for approval**- see pages 5-6 of this Agenda.
3. **Public Comment**
4. **New Business and Action Items:**
 - a. Deaccession of 'Urban Art Deco' the Zach Keiss Alleyway Mural - Staff and the RAMP committee recommend deaccessioning the "Urban Art Deco' mural by Zach Keiss that is located in the Downtown Art Alleyway. The mural was installed in 2014 in collaboration with the DDA. The DDA agrees that the mural is ready for deaccession. Staff and the DDA have concluded the artwork is damaged to an extent where repair is unreasonable or impractical. ACTION: Vote to finalize the deaccession process.



- b. Art Acquisition - The RAMP committee, DDA and City staff recommend purchasing Migration/Transformation by Annette Coleman with Art Acquisition funds. The suggestion is to install the sculpture downtown near Chase Bank at 8th St and 9th Ave. This sculpture purchase

will help fulfill our promise to the DDA by filling one of the pedestals they purchased for the downtown area. Kim recently spoke with Annette Coleman, one of the Uptown Tree applicants who was not chosen to send in a 3D model. They discussed the artist's process of doing mosaics that has stood the test of time in Colorado. At Kim's request, Annette sent her a photo of a sculpture she has available for purchase, if another town does not acquire it for 'on loan' before we speak up. Bianca from the DDA thinks it would look good on the pedestal at 9th Ave and 8th Street where the current feather sculpture is located ACTION: Vote to approve the purchase of 'Migration/Transformation' for \$12,000.

Description: Migration, environment and nature are all aspects of this sculpture. The monarch butterfly moves from Mexico northward to pollinate crops and wild flowers and brings with it beautiful colors that dance throughout our landscape, just like the immigrants that have come to our country over the years to add their colorful cultures.



Migration/Transformation - Medium: Stained glass mosaic sculpture - 9' x 4' x 2.5' - \$12,000.00
This sculpture won the Dave Davis Juror award in Grand Junction's Art On The Corner and was outside for two years in Colorado's challenging freeze-thaw weather. (2019-21).

- c. New Murals – Recreation Supervisor Scott Schuttenberg has brought to our attention that there is a lot of square footage of empty wall space in the pool area at the Greeley Funplex. He is requesting the Art Commission consider having murals painted in that space. Is this something we want to add to our Paint the Town program in the next year or two? ACTION: Vote to approve adding new murals in the Greeley Funplex pool area.

5. Project Reports:

- a. Uptown Trees 2021-2022 –Four artists have agreed to submit a 3-D model to scale of their proposed design. Each artists will receive \$300 for completing their final submission. The selection committee will review models on Dec. 2, 2021.
- b. 12 St Storm Outfall –An RFQ has been posted to Café to solicit an artist with a deadline of November 16. .
- c. Kim begun attending meetings on the 16th St corridor project (8th Ave to 10th Ave); this project is now active again with a tentative schedule of design in 2022 and construction/ art installation in 2023.
- d. Fire Station #6 – in progress
- e. Excel Energy Utility Cabinets – Our point of contact is changing and we expect that to slow down the progress.
- f. IG Trailhead Marker Art – No changes
- g. New Rodarte Bus Wrap – on hold

- a. Skate parks got hit by some major graffiti
- b. Two murals in the Alleyway have been tagged with Graffiti; Frank Garza has been called to handle the removal.
- c. 'Spectrum' Art Alleyway mural - Frank Garza is repairing a tear in his mural
- d. 'The History of Greeley Transportation' - Repairs to the artwork at the Transit Center have been postponed until 2022.
- e. Peakview Park skate park 'Range' additions to design – Installation scheduled for November 9, 2021.

Ed Rogers called the meeting to order.

A motion to approve the September minutes was made by Dik Munson and seconded by Tom Devore. The August minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business and Action Items:

1. Uptown Trees 2021-2022 – The Selection Committee reviewed design sketches and narrowed a list to four artists: Anna Botero, Kristin DeSantis, Kiki Goti, and Noah Ives. They will receive \$300 to complete a 3-D model to submit for final review. Following discussion, Robb Casseday motioned to approve final candidates. Tony Miller seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.
2. Art Donation – To accommodate a donation of Japanese Pottery by Masuo Ojima, the RAMP Committee and staff recommended the purchase of cabinets for proper storage. A motion to approve forward progress in acquiring the cabinets with a budget of not more than \$10,000 was made by Tom Devore. The motion was seconded by Robb Casseday, and passed unanimously.
3. 12th St Storm Outfall – a selection committee including staff from Culture and Stormwater recommended posting the RFQ to Café for artist solicitation. A motion to approve the RFQ was made by Dik Munson, seconded by Eddie Mirick; and passed unanimously.
4. Deaccession of “Urban Art Deco’ mural - after discussion with the DDA, staff and RAMP committee recommended deaccession of the painting. A motion to support the deaccession was made by Eddie Mirick. It was seconded by Tony Miller, then passed unanimously.
5. The commission agreed to approve moving the December meeting to one week earlier on December 14th.
6. Kim notified the Commission that the Outreach budget request was denied.
7. Dik Munson, vice chair, will act as interim chair until new officers are selected in January 2022.
8. The board will be reviewing the possibility of roundabout artwork.
