 - a. Leslie Evans will be joining our meetings to take notes for us.
 - b. Stan Scott is our new Public Art Technician who will be helping with the Gallery and Art Maintenance.

5. **New Business and Action Items:**
 - a. Uptown Trees 2021-2022 – The Selection Committee recommends inviting each of the following four artists to submit a final design that will include a 3-D model to scale. Artists will receive \$300 for completing their final submission. Selection committee will review models on Dec. 2, 2021.
 - i. Anna Botero
 - ii. Kristin DeSantis
 - iii. Kiki Goti
 - iv. Noah Ives
 - b. Art Donation - A very generous donation has been offered to the City that includes a 30 piece collection of Japanese Pottery by Masuo Ojima. The RAMP Committee and staff recommend the purchase of display cabinets sometime in 2022 or 2023 to safely display the collection. Funds generated from CCN/CCS/City Hall renovations might be used. Early research of pre-made cabinets suggests a budget of \$5,000- \$10,000 may be needed for the project. If approved, staff will continue to work with the RAMP committee to make decisions such as type of display case, location, etc. ACTION: Vote to approve moving forward with acquiring display cabinets with a budget of not more than \$10,000.
 - c. 12 St Storm Outfall – a selection committee including two commissioners and staff from Culture and Stormwater have met and recommend posting the RFQ to Café to solicit an artist. Action: Approve the RFQ presented today or recommend changes.

- d. Deaccession of 'Urban Art Deco' the Zach Keiss Alleyway Mural - Staff and the RAMP committee recommend deaccessioning the "Urban Art Deco" mural by Zach Keiss that is located in the Downtown Art Alleyway. The mural was installed in 2014 in collaboration with the DDA. The DDA agrees that the mural is ready for deaccession. Staff and the DDA have concluded the artwork is damaged to an extent where repair is unreasonable or impractical. ACTION: Vote to begin the deaccession process.



- e. Staff recommends the regular Art Commission meeting scheduled for December 21 be moved one week earlier due to how the holidays fall. This would move the meeting date to Tuesday December 14, 2021. Consensus is requested.
- f. The Outreach budget increase request for 2022 is currently unfunded; it looks like we will to adjust for this cut again next year.
- g. With Ed Rogers stepping down after this October 2022 meeting, we have two solutions to keep running the next three GAC meetings. Dik Munson, Vice Chair for the GAC, is willing to run the meetings until we vote for new members in January 2023. The other option is to vote to temporarily fill the position at this October meeting and then permanently fill it in January 2023. The RAMP committee does not recommend voting in a new officer at this time. We would like your input on this matter.
- h. CCI nuggets of info – other towns are successfully adding art to roundabouts
- i. Andy, Kim & Jason want to thank Ed Rogers for all his intense dedication and passion to the Art Commission and to the Arts as a whole in Greeley. Ed has been on the Art Commission with us for the past 13 years!

- e. East Greeley Park Art/Chair Danyelle –**Park dedication has been moved to Saturday October 2, 3-5pm.** We will have a table for Wes to provide a rock painting art activity for the public. Art Installation for Balsam Park will be Sept/Oct 2021. The art Installation in the Natural Area will be summer 2022.

They assured him they are still working away but also struggling with some supply lines interruptions due to COVID. Case in point, they've been waiting for a part for their welder since early July.
