6. **New Business and Action Items:**
  - a. Traffic Cabinet vinyl Wraps (slides #1-6) – Staff and the Paint the Town Committee recommend the purchase of six artists’ designs to be printed on vinyl and installed on six traffic cabinets in 2021. [ACTION: Vote to approve the six artists’ designs presented.](#)
  - b. Unity Tree Deaccession (slide # 7) – Staff and the RAMP committee recommend approving the second and final vote to deaccession the Unity Tree by artist Roberto Roma that is located near 1415 8<sup>th</sup> Ave. The powder-coated metal sculpture was installed in 2014. City staff and the artist researched restoration options and did not find an option for a reasonable cost. Staff has concluded the artwork is damaged to an extent where repair is unreasonable or impractical. The recommendation to deaccession the sculpture was posted to the Public with no responses. [ACTION: Vote to approve the second and final vote to deaccession the Unity Tree.](#)
  - c. [Glenmere Park Art \(slides #8-11\)](#) - Staff and the Selection committee including neighborhood volunteers recommend approving two Lyman Whitaker kinetic sculptures and the Ted Schaal ‘Compass Rose’ to be installed at the location in Glenmere Park as shown in the slides. [ACTION: Vote to approve two Lyman Whitaker Kinetic art pieces and the Ted Schaal ‘Compass Rose’ for purchase with donated funds by the anonymous donor.](#)
  - d. Art Commission quarterly inspections of artwork has begun. Information was sent out via email. We will be using Survey Monkey once again for commissioners to report any maintenance concerns.

**7. Project Reports:**

- a. InStall Art – An Email vote was tallied showing the majority of votes to approve the Final Design for “In-stall Art” first floor women’s room; 11 Commissioners responded with a yay vote, 1 Commissioner was not able to respond. The second floor restroom art wraps have been installed. Mario Echevarria is currently working with Raven Signs to prep his design for printing.
- b. Winds of Change II – No Changes- Art is scheduled to be installed July 2020.
- c. East Greeley Park Art/Chair Danyelle – No changes. Art installations for Balsam Park and the Natural Area are projected for September/October 2021. Wes is happy with the park design and sees lots of opportunities to incorporate his artwork. Wes has been given the ‘go ahead’ by the committee to create his art ‘in the field’ as he goes. His ideas will be fluid, yet they will stay true to the concepts we have approved
- d. Fire Station #6 – No Changes. We will be looking at a possible July 2021 installation.
- e. IG Trailhead Marker Art – conversations have begun with artist Marjorie Leggitt for botanical drawings that might be placed at the new Island Grove Poudre trailhead.
- f. Excel Energy Utility Cabinets - we had request from Xcel asking for box locations for their tech’s to check for live/dead fronts; we are hopeful that we can wrap additional boxes this Fall or in the Spring 2022.

**8. Maintenance & Repair**

- a. Butterfly Ball – No Changes – waiting for a longer span of warm weather.
- b. Repairs will be made to ‘The History of Greeley Transportation’ at the Transit Center in May. Artist Kirk Seese will bring a new ‘Feather’ sculpture for us to purchase during the same visit.

### **New Business**

1. Unity Tree Deaccession –
  - a. The Uptown Tree Unity Tree by Roberto Roma has deteriorated to the point that the artwork is damaged to an extent where repair is unreasonable or impractical. After a discussion, Eddie Mirick motioned to vote on deaccession which was seconded by Dik Munson. The motion was passes unanimously. Kim Snyder will post the motion for public comment with the final vote taking place at the April meeting.
2. Quarterly Inspection
  - a. Commissioners will begin inspections of artwork in April, and will assess the condition of works throughout the city. Each committee member has accepted around ten pieces to inspect.

### **Non-Action Items Open for Questions**

1. Ramp Committee: The Rodarte Center will purchase a new used bus, and the subcommittee has recommended the bus be wrapped with the same design that was used on the existing bus. A second bus may be purchased in the future and the committee recommends that the Commission consider opening a new project to wrap that bus with a newly created design. It was approved to use the existing design to wrap the new used bus that will be purchased, and to open a new project for a new bus design possibly scheduled for 2022.
2. Sanctuary Tree: The Uptown Tree Sanctuary Tree may be relocated because of construction on 8<sup>th</sup> Ave. to keep it safe.
3. Kim Snyder requested input from the committee on the 2023 Art Master Plan which will help direct Public Art for the next five to ten years.
4. Coloring Books have been distributed to all third graders in the Greeley/School District 6 schools.
