V. Staff report:

a. CIP Update: Capital Improvement Plan Budget for 2024 Projects: Paul Trombino

The following are some of the projects the City of Greeley is working on for the year 2024:

- Sidewalk improvements with GURA funds, most of the work will be on the Eastside of town
- Signal detection and traffic signal repairs and improvements
- Bestway site at 35th Ave, previously used the A St site for storage of equipment, traffic poles, materials, and supplies.
- 10th St adaptive signal upgrade down the corridor
- Bridge maintenance
- Neighborhood Safety Improvements
- Annual pavement rehabilitation program and concrete repair/replacement (KGM)
 - 23rd Ave from 4th St and 5th St redesign
 - Turn lane at 20th St from 47th Ave to 59th Ave design
 - 35th Ave from F St to O St
 - 8th Ave improvements
 - 9th St and 10th St mobility enhancements
 - C St from 58th Ave to 66th Ave, Phase 1
 - MERGE project
 - O St at 59th Ave intersection, improvement roundabout
 - Greeley Mall redevelopment
 - 95th Ave bridge over Poudre River
 - US 34 and 15th Ave Ct underpass improvement
 - City EV charging plan
 - SMART City plan (application)
 - 16th St enforcements

b. Transportation: Free Fare Ridership: Michelle Johnson

The Mobility department for the months of June, July, and August had a Zero Free Fare program to promote the reduction of ozone, the program was a success with ridership over 40% compared to 2022.

An ordinance adding shared micro mobility business licenses was adopted into the City Code. This license establishes that businesses seeking to operate shared-used micro mobility (e-bikes, e-scooters) intended to be left in the public space between users must obtain a business license from the City of Greeley.

The Mobility department along with Parking Services staff have been going out to the High School to help alleviate the traffic and flow of vehicles parked outside the school during the end of day, it has also helped with the time points of city buses during those times as well.

The Mobility department attended the CASTA conference last week and received the Outstanding Coordinator Award for helping disabled students attend classes at the UCHealth hospital.

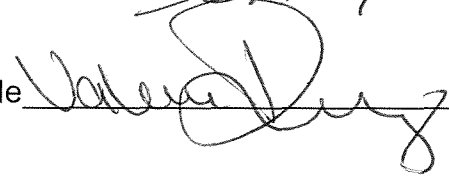
