4. New Business/ Action Items
 - New mural to replace 'Courage Mural.'
As some of you know, the Courage Mural was painted on the building of 8th Ave and 7th street, the Wonderhands printing studio, and the stucco under the mural has been failing for some time. The owners of the building have been encouraged to renovate the wall so the mural can be replaced. The owners are now ready to scrap the old stucco, including the mural, and add new stucco. The DDA are talking with the original artists, Armando Silva and Wes Sam Bruce, to paint a new mural after the building wall is in good repair. They have asked if the Art Commission would be interested in collaborating with them on the mural. This would include some project management assistance and funding.
 - Committee for RedTail Park
A new, small community park is being designed for the area of 71st Ave near Hwy 34 on the northeast corner. We need two volunteers to sit on the selection committee; our parks rep would be a great one.
 - New Inventory system: Public Art Archive- Megan and Kim are researching the Public Art Archive. One free offer they have is to place our entire collection with pics and a small description on their page for all to see. They also have a good system to keep all our inventory info for each piece in one place. This option costs \$2,000 per year. Considering that our collection is worth approximately 4.5 million, staff thinks this is very reasonable. We have tried two other 'free' options that do not work well.
 - A new street mural project at the corner of 7th Ave and 16th st in partnership with Atlas Theater/Ambry Owners (Kelly and Jeff Cook) and Public Works. Kelly has submitted the

intersection art design as shown below for Art Commission Approval, no further action will be needed from the commission because PW will take ownership and will be responsible for the maintenance of the project.

Non-Action Items Below: Please read before the meeting. These items will only be addressed if you have questions, to request more information or if the committee chair would like to share updates.

5. Project Reports:

- a. Longview Park- the installation has been completed.
- b. Paint the Town Traffic Cabinets- Jury is moving forward and will have recommendations for the GAC in April.
- c. New Donation titled 'Committed' – a dedication will be held in the spring.
- d. Discovery Bay Vinyl Wrap- waiting for warmer Spring Weather.
- e. 12th St outfall- four foundations have been poured. The art will be installed in May or June- we are at the discretion of the overall project timeline.
- f. 16th St- the project has been slowed down so the city can locate underground pipes, etc. Art will be installed in spring or summer 2025.
- g. Delta Park- we are in the process of contracting with Armando Silva to design and create artwork. The design team would like to see something like an archway at the north entrance to the park. The community will be involved with the design.

6. Maintenance & Repair

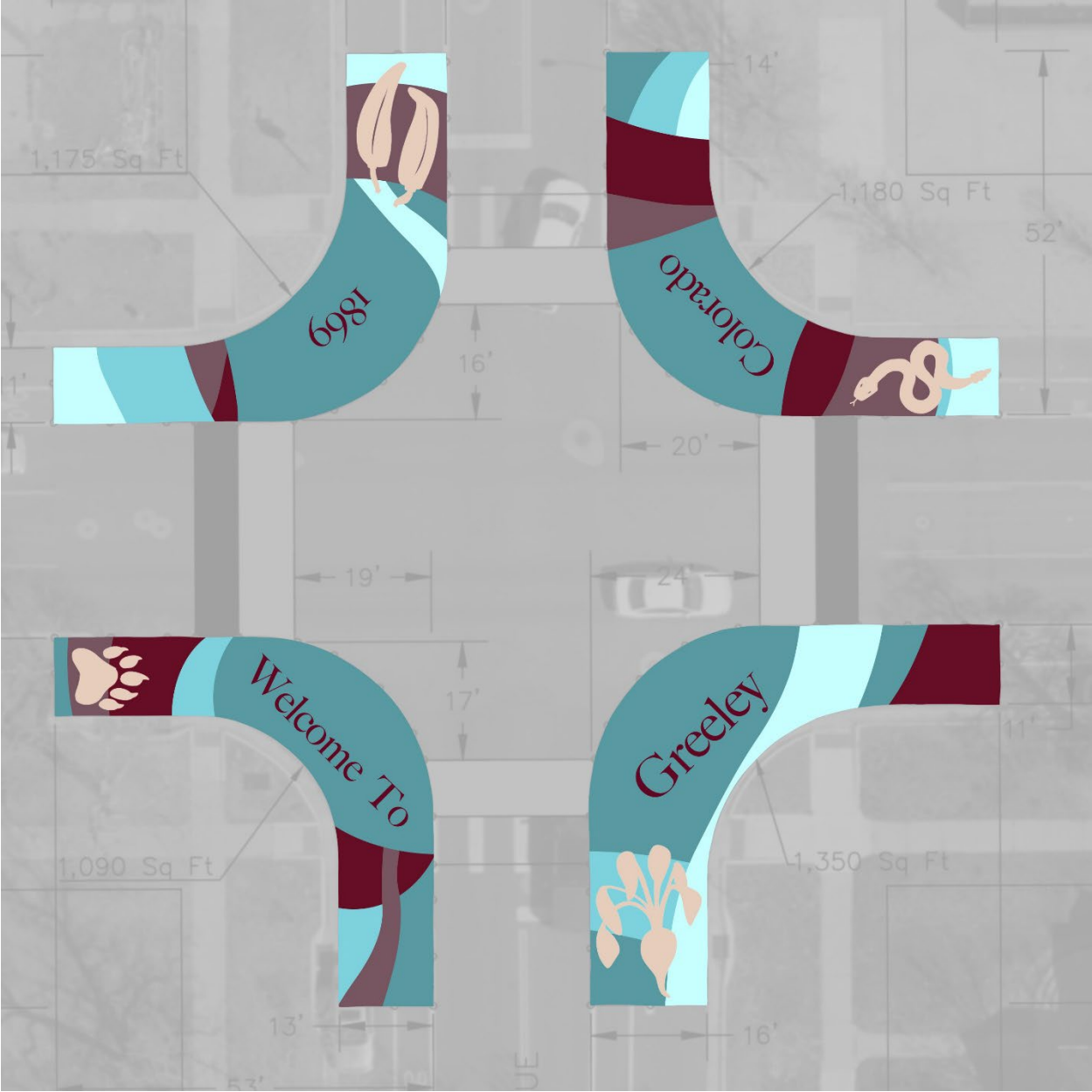
- a. Vandalism clean-ups- The oasis bench in Bittersweet Park has been tagged and will be cleaned off this week by Jo Decker: our Bronze cleaner.
- b. 'Building Seas', an aluminum sculpture located in Centennial Park has been damaged either by very strong winds or someone running into it. The welds have been compromised; Jon Anaya, Parks Manager, has agreed to deliver the piece to Precision Welding for the repair.
- c. The new uptown Tree located at LINC has chipped paint where two pieces are rubbing in the wind. The artwork is still under warranty and the artist will be in Greeley in May to touch up paint and amend the artwork so the scraping will not continue. The newly poured replacement planter has been installed.

7. Other

- a. Tointon Gallery Exhibit: 'Changing Landscapes: Transformative Observations Through printmaking' is an exhibit celebrating the month of printmaking with the work of Rhiannon Alpers, Jennifer Ghormley, Theresa Haberkorn, Johanna Mueller, Ashley Nason, Sarah Wallace Scott, and Melanie Yazzie. The artist's reception date and time is March 22 5-7 p.m. The exhibit will be up through April 26th.
