11:45am – 12:05pm: Shelter Feasibility Study Update-Mandy Shreve

- a. Executive committee identified 365 day, 24/7 Shelter is a priority
- b. City of Greeley has partnered with consultant to identify potential sites for shelter based on zoning, ownership, size, access to transportation, access to services, and impact on surrounding area.
- c. Narrowed down to 3-4 potential sites. Next step will be detailed analysis of these.
- d. 3rd phase will be developing what we want the shelter to look like, configuring the cost to build and upkeep of the operation of the shelter.

- a. Discussed need for resource providers to work together to provide resources to community

12:25pm – 12:40pm: StarRise Update-Jodi Hartmann

- a. Jodi presented information regarding the history and development of StarRise
- b. Development will provide 58, 1-bedroom affordable housing to homeless and low-income families.
- c. Construction should be completed in November 2025
- d. Working on finalizing supportive services. They have partnered with North Range to bring in onsite peer support and case managers.
- e. They plan to expand on the property in near future with hopes to build 90 units for families using tax money and credits.



12:40pm – 12:55 pm: Data Updates from Other Agencies

- a. Each resource provider reported data points to group on number households housed, number households help prevent homelessness, number of households turned away, and number of households discharged /graduated.

12:55pm – 1:00 pm: Final Thoughts and Closing Statement

- a. Reflections from Dr. Sam: Number of people approaching programs and programs not having the capacity to serve them. With all the good work why are people still homeless? Rise in costs and there isn't capacity in programs due to lacking in funding for programs.
- b. Mandy reaffirmed a strategic vision is needed with the growth of the city. We need to be informed about the increase of housing prices and continue to seek solutions, so we are prepared and keep people from entering into homelessness.
- c. Mayor Gates stated "Simply put this is what collaboration looks like and I am happy to have my name attached to this taskforce."
