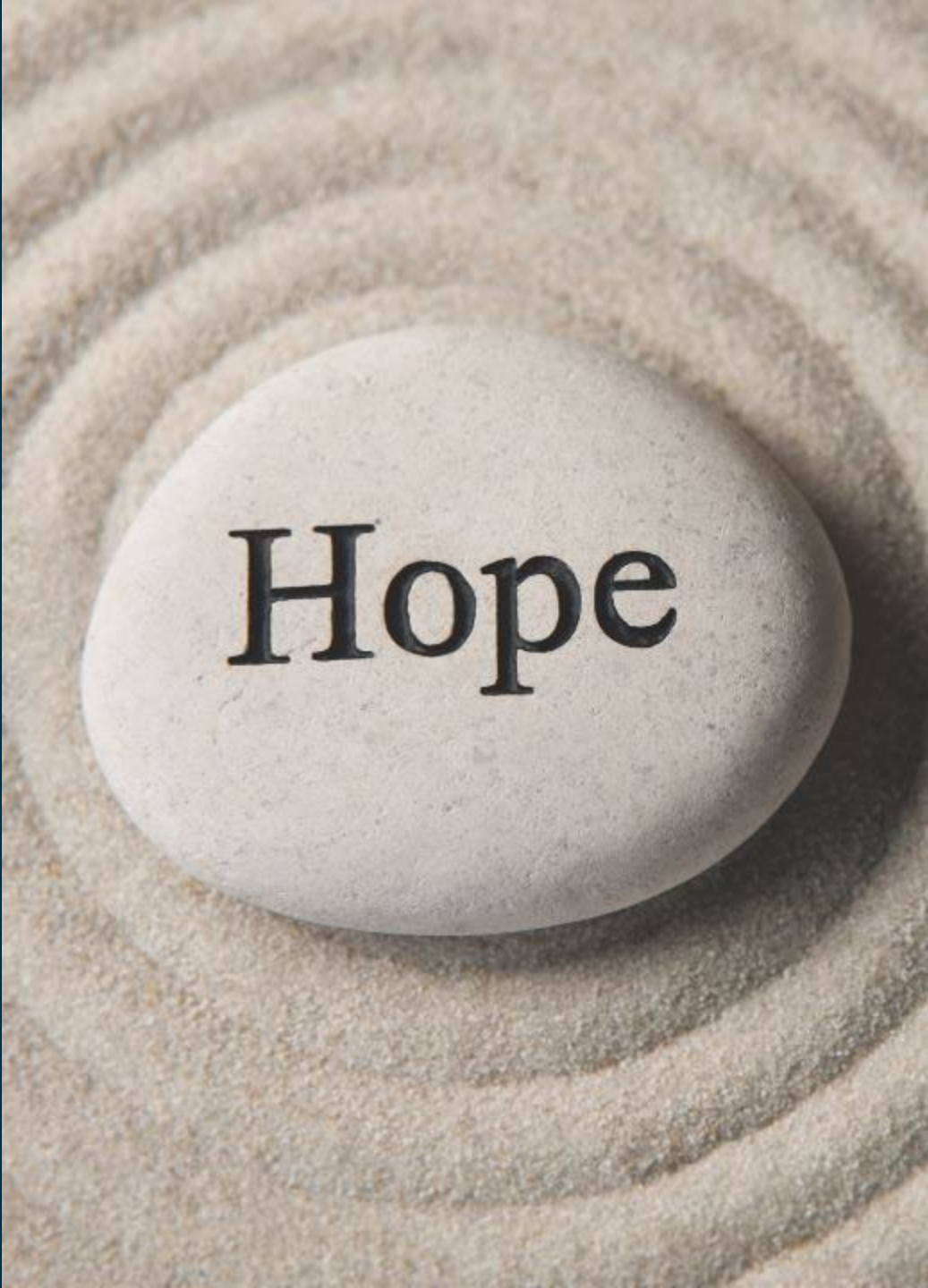

Crisis Support Services

Who do we serve?

- People in crisis as they define it
- People of all ages
- People of any payer/ insurance or lack thereof
- People in Weld County regardless of where they call home

Where hope begins.

Co-Responders



Co-Responders aid first responders in responding to people with mental health concerns and assisting with resources.

Co-Responders can come on-scene with first responders to help de-escalate and assess behavioral health situations. Co-responders may also follow up on a call when first responders identify that behavioral health support might be helpful.

Crisis Stabilization Services

Acute Treatment Unit (ATU)

- 24-hour, 16 bed psychiatric hospital alternative program.
- A safe, treatment-centered program for individuals experiencing crisis; includes voluntary or involuntary holds.

Withdrawal Management (Detox)

- 24-hour, 23-bed social withdrawal management program for individuals who are intoxicated, in withdrawal, or at risk for withdrawal. Includes involuntary and voluntary admissions.
- Clients are served by staff specifically trained to work with people struggling with addictions such as certified addiction technicians and specialists.

Substance Use Disorder Residences

Hazel Chick Center



True North offers morning and afternoon tracks with support levels that increase or decrease, based on individual needs.

Wings: Women's substance use disorder intensive residential and outpatient treatment facility. Serves pregnant women and women with children, from infants to age 5.

Recovery Homes: Serve as an aftercare and/or transitional group living environment for recovering men and women (and their children) who have substance use disorder challenges.

Substance Use Disorder (SUD)

North Range Behavioral Health offers a range of proven approaches and treatments for all ages that can treat substance use disorders.

We believe in respecting personal dignity, reducing shame, and infusing hope in recovery.

Where hope begins.

Medication Assisted Therapy (MAT)

MAT combines behavioral therapy and medications to treat substance use disorders by offering safe, proven approaches to control symptoms and cravings to help people stay focused on therapy and recovery goals.

- A shared model of care: Sunrise Community Health, North Range, and on-site pharmacies.
- Addiction specialists, therapists and physicians act as a treatment team to assess and treat as a team.
- A recovery peer specialist helps link individuals to MAT as well as other supports.

Adult Services

Dale Peterson Building



Adult Outpatient Program (AOP): Support for those living with severe and persistent mental illness.

Adult Recovery Program (ARP): Individual therapy for adults with mental health issues, substance use disorders and co-occurring disorders.

Assertive Community Treatment (ACT): Can reduce hospitalizations and provide wellness support for those living with severe and persistent mental illness.

Adult Services

Behavioral Alternative Services in Community (BASIC): Focuses on the mental and substance use challenges that often impact those involved with the legal system.

Supported Employment through Individual Placement and Support (IPS): Helps individuals find steady, competitive, supported employment to enhance recovery.

Jail-based Behavioral Services (JBBS): Provides behavioral health therapy and case management services to inmates and consultation to correctional facility staff as requested. Staff are embedded at the jail.

Integrated Care



Monfort Family Clinic

Our integrated care system provides well-rounded, comprehensive healthcare. Clinicians and medical providers team up and work with clients to identify challenges that impact physical health and mental health.

With this system, it's much easier for clients to see a specialist who can address both behavioral and physical health concerns in the same setting. This can help prevent health problems before they occur or treat them before they become too serious.

Frontier House



Frontier House

Frontier House is a local community center that offers people who have mental illness hope and opportunities to achieve their full potential.

During the course of their participation in a Clubhouse, members gain access to opportunities to rejoin the worlds of friendships, family, employment and education, and to the services and support they may individually need to continue their recovery.

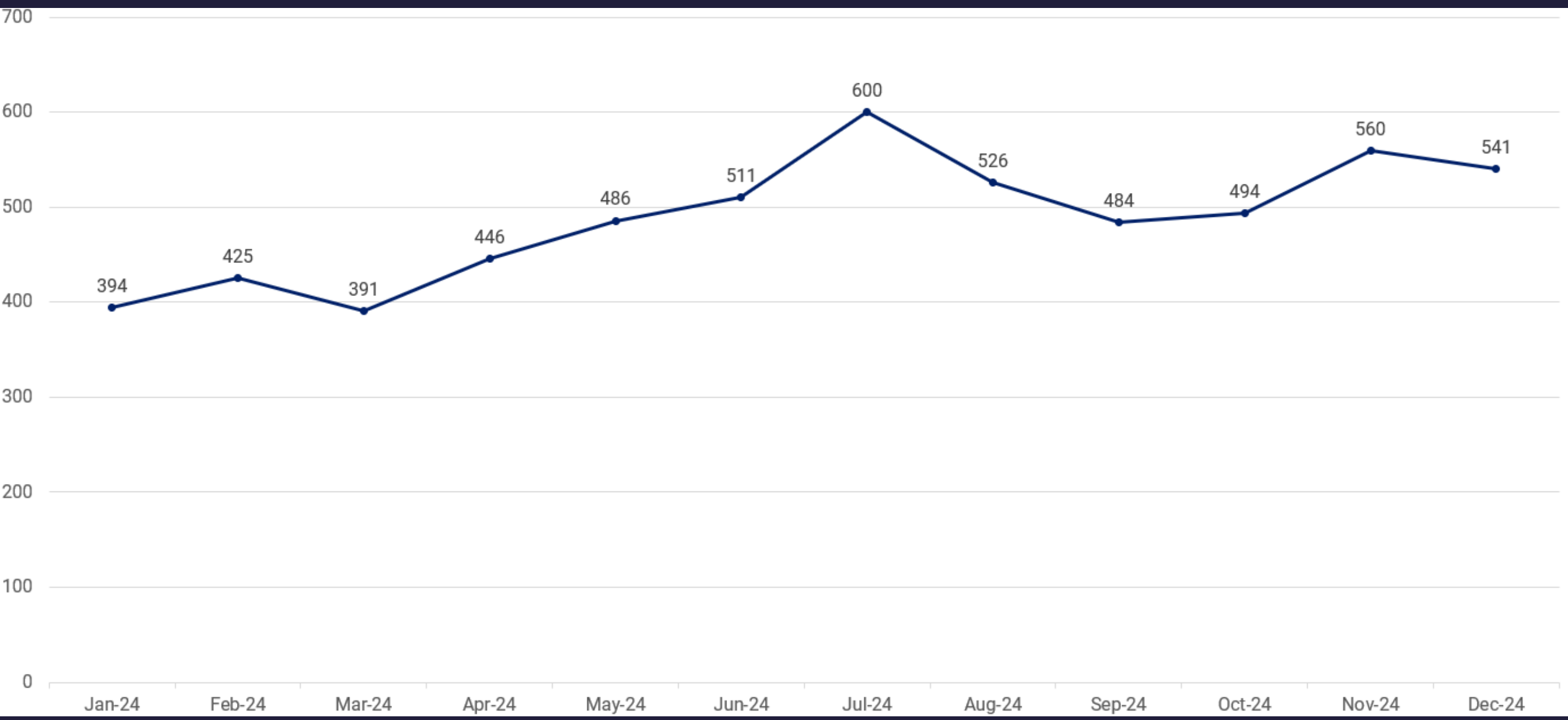

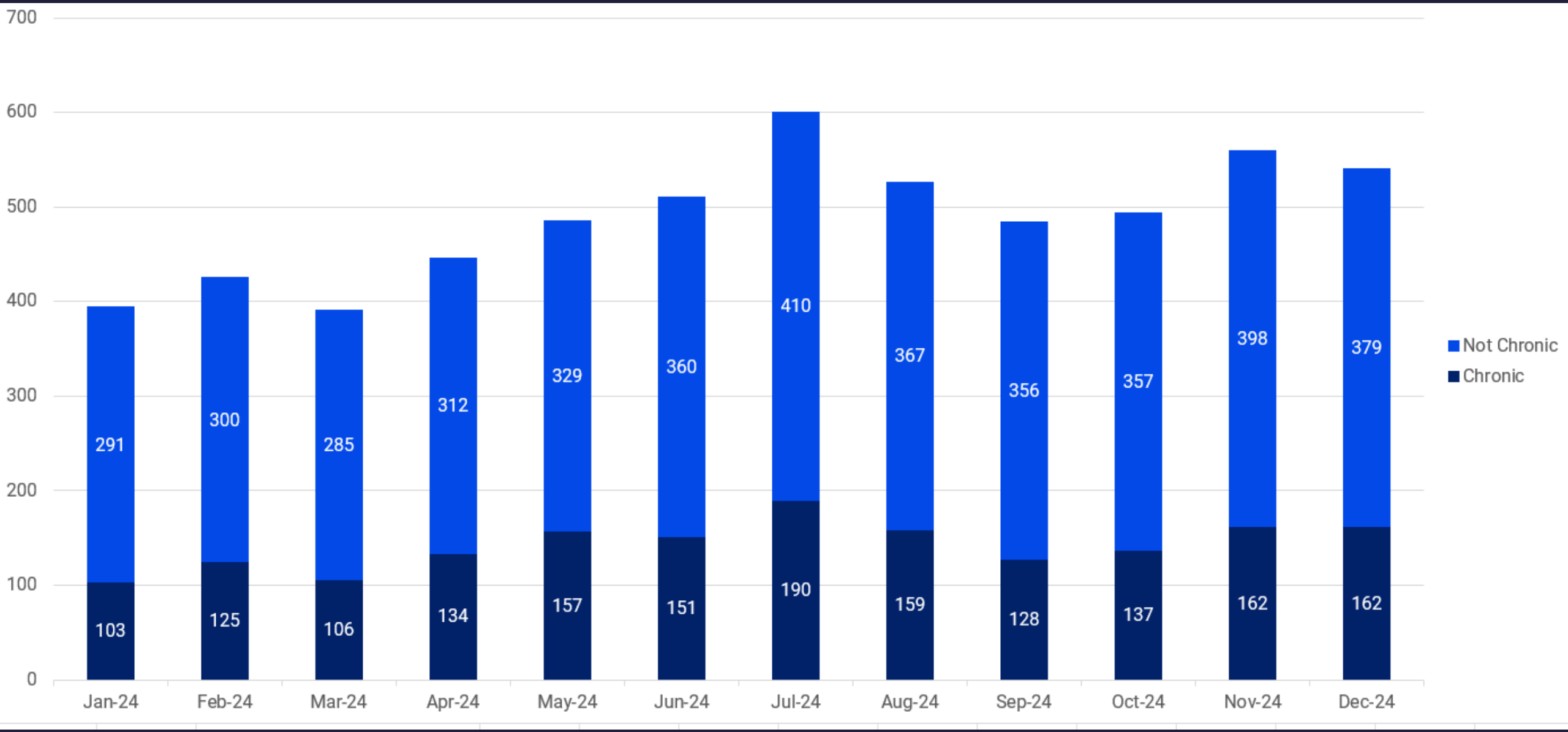

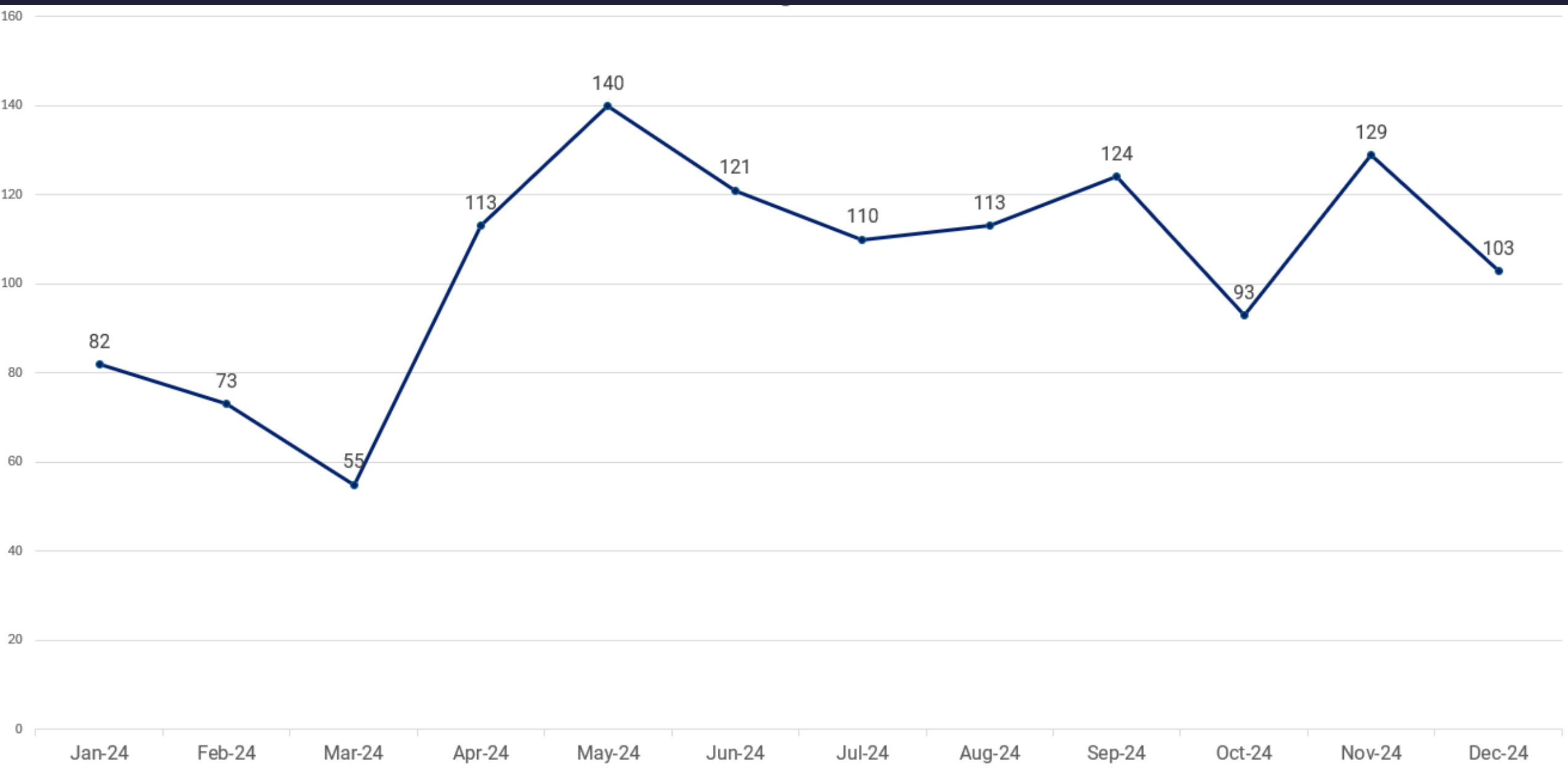
Number of Individuals Served



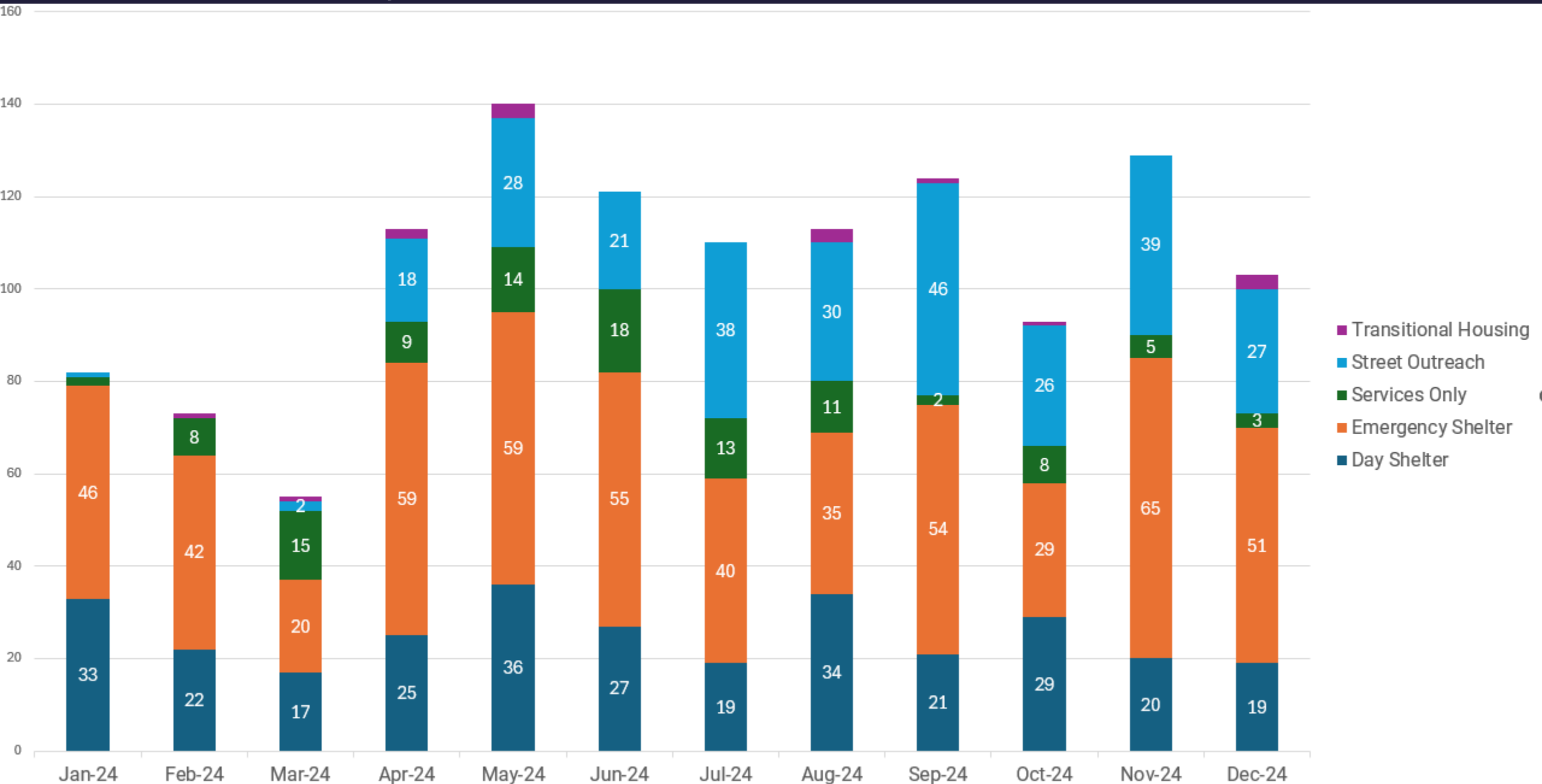
Number of Individuals Served



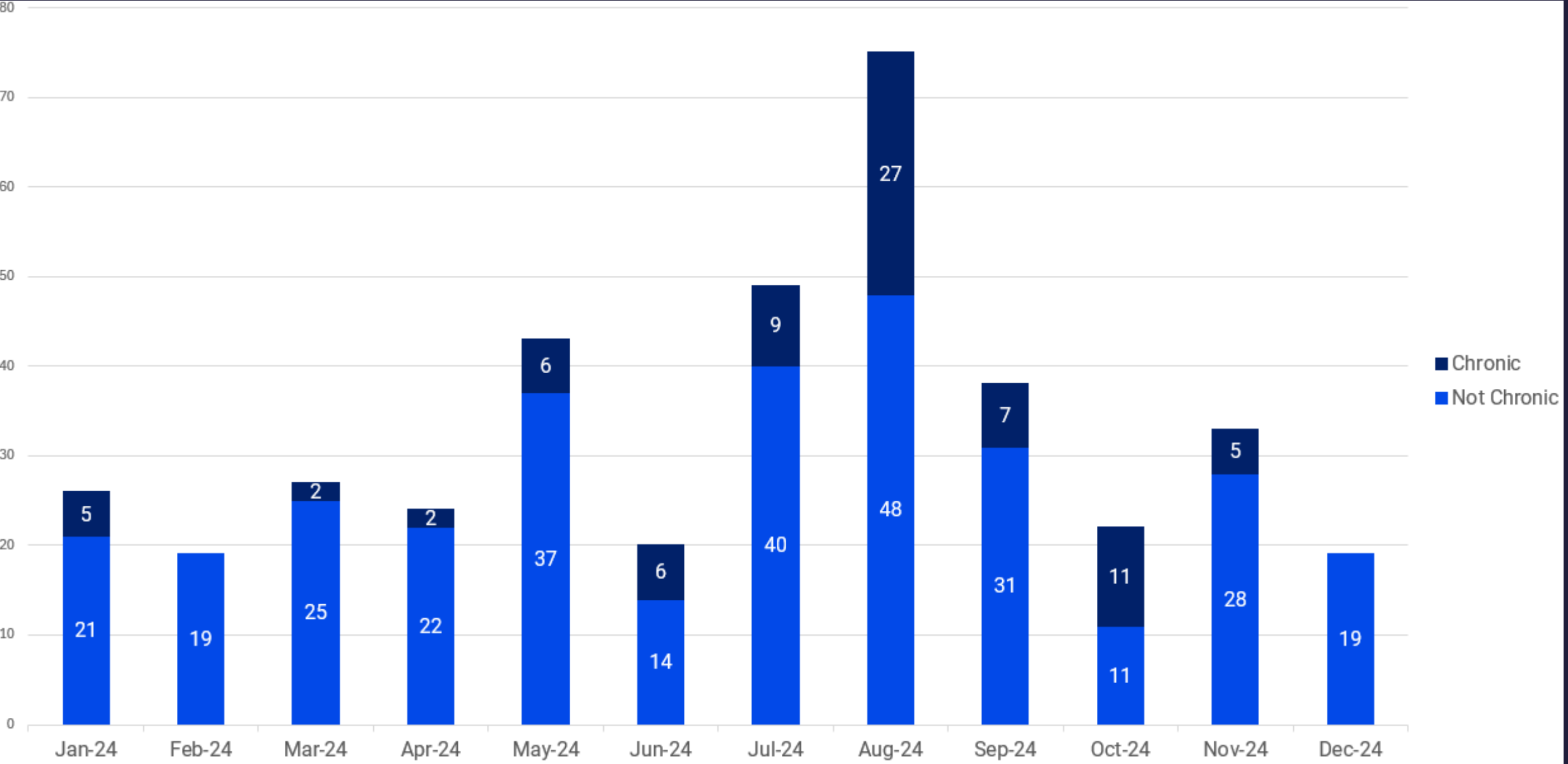
Number of Individuals Newly Enrolled



Number of Individuals Newly Enrolled



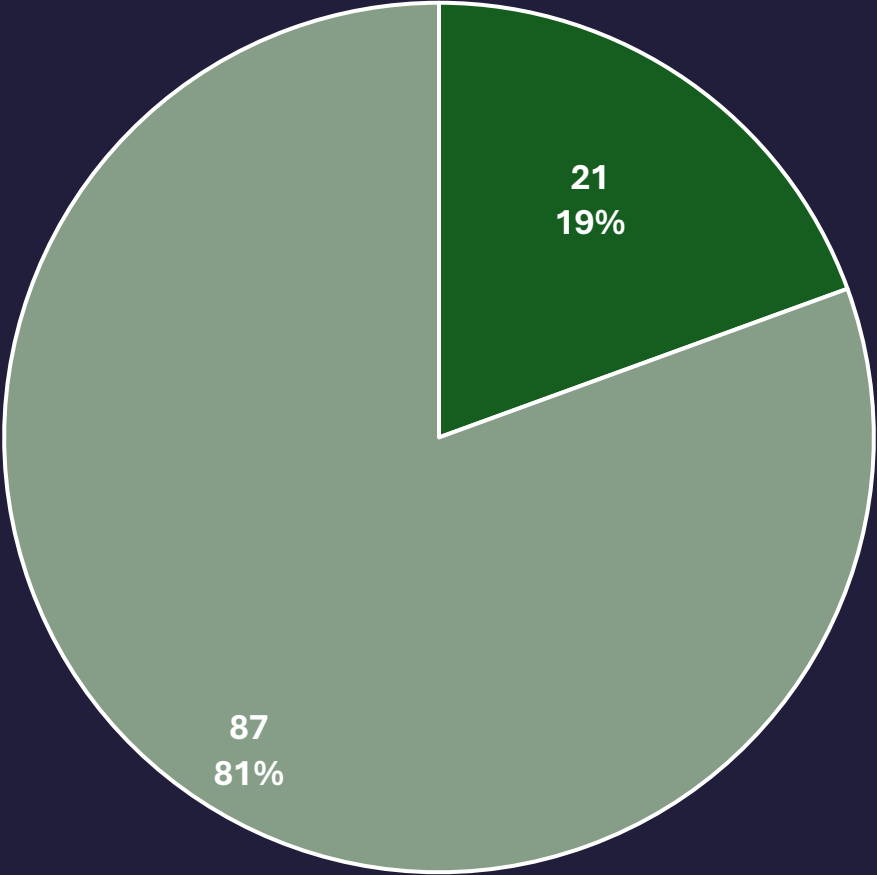
Number of Individuals Housed

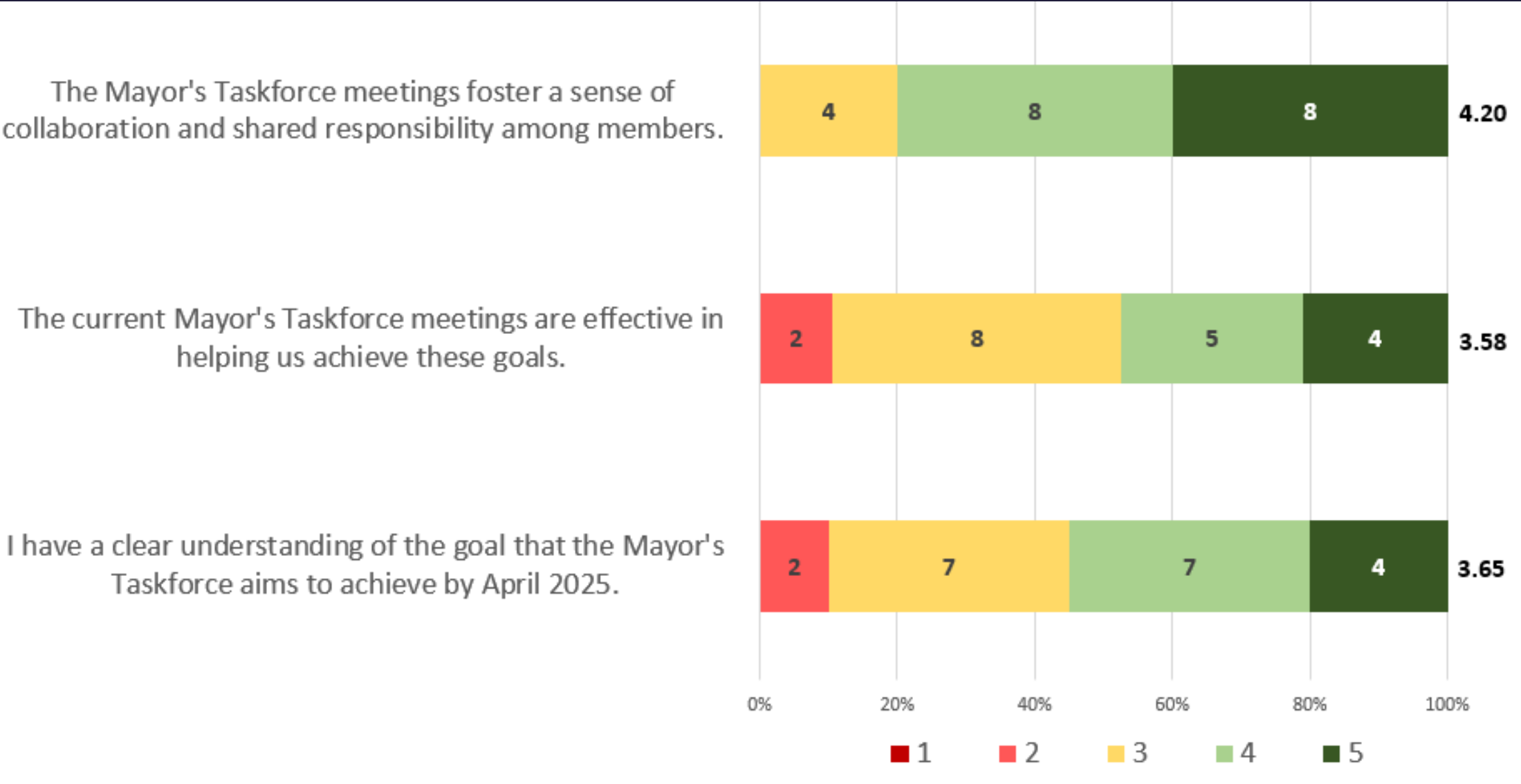
Mayor's Task Force Survey Results

Survey Results



What aspects of the current goal do you find unclear or need more information about?

“I understand the why and what but the how is not as clear.”

“I am unclear on the differentiation between what the Taskforce's objectives/goals are compared to the City's objectives/goals“

“I feel very 'in the loop" but I am in several subcommittees. I wonder if the broader group needs additional information or reports from the subcommittees to have a fuller picture?”

“To be fair, I have not attended every meeting but a more definitive timeline with goals and outcomes would benefit me.”

What do you believe should be the primary goal for the Mayor's Taskforce in 2025? How do you envision your agency contributing to the realization of that goal?

“Ending homelessness.”

“What and how much is each agency going to contribute to the goal of a 24/7 facility?”

“I think the goals should be to reduce the number of people experiencing homelessness in our area. We can be an advocate and partner.”

“Clear understanding of the capacity of community, where gaps exist, eliminate duplicity. And, get everyone to contribute something.”

What additional topics or activities would you like to see included in future meetings to better support our goals?

“I would like to see more involvement with the CoC.”

“Success stories of clients”

“Share any grant opportunities you find that may benefit the group.”

“Additional overviews of what has been successful in other cities.”

“Efforts underway to further engage governmental partners in this work (Weld, Evans, Garden City, etc.)”

What suggestions do you have to improve collaboration within the taskforce?

“Data on the actual costs to the entire system, e.g., police/fire/ems time, parks/public works clean up, jail time, shelter, transit”

“A directory of those on the task force.”

“The group seems to be rather large. Wondering if there needs to be subgroups who report out to the larger groups.”

“Transparency on the progress.”

“I would like to see partners in the community paired and collaborate on data or on creating potential solutions based off of the high success rates”

What do you think is working well in the Mayor's Taskforce meetings? What improvements would you suggest for future meetings?

“Regular meetings, would like to see more outreach to other agencies.”

“We need community leaders to demand more of our county government.”

“I think the data elements are powerful. The stories of impact and progress are incredible.”

“Appreciate the data. How could we help the city share this data with the community?”

“I'd suggest opening up "ride-alongs" for those who still are on the fence of the impact.”

2025 to 2026 Goal Planning

- Use HMIS data to inform decision making
- Consider what interventions are working and having the biggest impact
- Develop shared community goals/ objectives
- Develop action items on how to meet our shared objectives
- Measure progress and re-evaluate

Stella M Modeling

HUD System Modeling that provides a model and cost projections for a fully-resourced homelessness response system.

- Conduct work sessions with community members and agencies on activities, to develop:
- Homeless System map to build upon Community Mapping
 - Map would identify the core project types envisioned within the system and how they connect to form rehousing pathways for different cohorts of people experiencing homelessness
- Estimate of inflow and long-term homelessness
- Data-informed and community-informed assumptions about the percentages of inflow and long-term homeless universes that need various rehousing pathways to exit homelessness
- Annualized unit cost estimates for core program models

Stella M Modeling

- Analysis of current inventory/ resources, to reflect one-time and sustained capacity gaps
- Funding projections to fill system gaps
- Recommendations for implementation of specific actions
