




The Citizen Transportation Advisor Board Minutes


March 24, 2025, at 3:00 pm

1. Call to Order
 - Thomas Donkle called the meeting to order at 3:04 pm
2. Roll Call
 - Board/Commission member present – Thomas Donkle, Jimmy Jones, Jim Riesberg, James Bailey, Steve Teets, Eva Maines, Bart Smith, Wendi Young and Ally Johnson.
 - Board/Commission members absent – N/A

3. Approval of the minutes
 - The minutes from February 24, 2025, were approved by a motion and unanimous vote of the board members.
4. Citizen Input
 - No Citizens were present.
5. Old Business:
 - **Update on Triennial Questionnaire:** The March meeting was focused on the CTAB Triennial Review Committee’s challenges faced over the past three years, what hasn't worked well and what could help the board operate more effectively. The board members discuss challenges and potential improvements for their meetings and overall effectiveness. They express a desire for more actionable information, increased community involvement, and clearer purposes for the board. Members suggest creating subcommittees, attending community events, and receiving more timely information about public works projects. They also propose restructuring meetings to allow for public comments on specific agenda items and developing board-driven initiatives to better define their role and purpose.
 - **CIP Update:** Bhooshan Karnik gave a quick and brief update on the CIP project currently going on.
 - **Urban & Planning:** Downtown Mobility Strategy Storymap: Victoria Leonhardt presented a story map illustrating how various projects support downtown mobility. The map highlights the importance of downtown as the nexus of the transportation system and includes projects such as the 10th Street transit vision, premium transit corridor, and the Cooter River Restoration initiative. Victoria also discussed the need for a downtown mobility hub and the potential redesign of plazas. Victoria will be sharing the link with the group as it is intended to be an interactive tool for board members to explore more on their own.

- **Director Report:** Paul Trombino addressed 11 questions that the board members had, he went over them and answered/explained them.
6. New Business:
- Steve Teets asked what would go in replacement of the 8th Ave building and furniture store that was demolished. City of Greeley didn't demolish those buildings, but he was directed to Development Review to find out what will be replacing those two buildings.
 - Steve Teets asked why the NFRMPO presentation was removed from the agenda, he was informed it was due to presenter being sick.
 - Steve Teets wanted to invite the board to Weld County Mobility Committee to a meeting on May 27th at the Windsor Rec Center.
 - Tom Donkle discussed the Northern Colorado Water Service district's settlement and its potential impact on the city.
