4. Guest Speaker - Megan Weiler discussion on Moriya Japan Exchange program.
5. The Parks Department has requested help in finding an artist to paint the basketball court once a new one has been constructed. They have funding, so moving forward with the project does not need GAC approval. Because the artwork will be on City Property, the design itself will need to be approved by the Art Commission. The committee would like to contract with an artist who will develop a design with Rodarte Kids input this fall and paint the design next Spring. The committee is seeking approval to move forward with contracting local artist and art educator, Felisha Bower, for this project. Vote required.
6. Delta Park – Armando has submitted his final design for the pillars at the north and south entrances of the park. These pieces were meant to be entryway monuments. The final version will include more details, planes, and texture that simply can't be conveyed through a 2D rendering. Vote required.

1. The meeting was called to order by Heather Utrata at 4:00 p.m.

2. Approval of the August 2025 minutes.
Motion to approve the August 2025 minutes made by Perry Bell and seconded by Sharon Wright.
Motion passed unanimously.
3. The Greeley Arts Legacy presented a video from their website providing background of what they do and who they are. They then invited the board to the arts legacy reception on October 23rd.
4. Water treatment and reclamation art: The committee recommended 3-5 artists to be short-listed for the project. The first step is a tour of the facility and then the second step is to create a final proposal. This will all need to take place before the January 2026 Greeley Art Commission meeting. The committee searched through 58 artists that submitted an entry, and they narrowed it down to 4.
Motion to approve the short-listed artists made by Tony Miller and seconded by Sharon Wright.
Motion passed unanimously.
5. The Parks division reached out to request help in finding an artist to paint the basketball court at the Rodarte centers park. The goal of this project is to collaborate with the kids at the Rodarte center to create a design for the basketball court. Heather Utrata has volunteered to be on this committee, but we need one more person to volunteer. It was noted that the parks division has the funding for the project, so public art was asked to

help find the artist, and the commission will approve the artist and design before it is painted.

Kendra Albee volunteered to join the committee.

6. The 8th st plaza to the alleyway has been continuously vandalized for the past 3 years. A discussion was held to come up with some ideas on where we could move the artwork so that it does not get vandalized anymore. Moving the paintings to Lincoln Park, UCCC, or Island grove was brought up. There was also discussion about possibly covering the artwork with glass, or Plexi to help protect the paintings. The paintings range from 7-9 ft tall.
7. Non-Action Items:
 - Meeker House projection art event is scheduled for September 29th starting at 7 p.m.
