



The Citizen Transportation Advisor Board Minutes

July 28, 2025, at 3:00 pm

1. Call to Order
 - Thomas Donkle called the meeting to order at 3:06 pm
2. Roll Call
 - Board/Commission member present – Steve Teets, Tom Donkle, James Bailey, Jim Riesberg, Wendi Young and Ally Johnson.
 - Board/Commission members absent – Eva Maines and Jimmy Jones.
 - City Employees present – Michelle Johnson, Hanna Feldmann, Leroy Baca and Bhooshan Karnik.
 - Other guest in attendance – N/A
3. Approval of the minutes
 - The minutes from June 23, 2025, were approved by a motion and unanimous vote of the board members.
4. Citizen Input
 - No Citizens were present.
5. Old Business:
 - **Greeley Micro Mobility Update:** Hanna Feldmann presented an update on Greeley's shared micro-mobility pilot program, which launched in October 2024 with Spin as the operator. The program has seen 14,400 trips since launch, with 23% starting/ending on UNC's campus and 20% in the downtown development authority area. Hanna recommended expanding the service area, increasing dedicated parking areas, particularly in areas with narrow sidewalks, and continuing to use geofencing as a management tool. She also announced plans for a public survey and rider survey to be launched in mid-August, running through September, with results expected in October. The group also discussed the need for bike racks and safety education for scooter riders.
 - **School Transportation Update:** Michelle Johnson presented updates on school transportation, transit ridership, and safety initiatives. She discussed a 15% decrease in UNC transit ridership due to reduced bus service only providing two buses. She mentioned ongoing work with school districts on intergovernmental agreements (IGAs) for transportation and safety improvements. Leroy Baca highlighted plans for improved bike lanes, pedestrian crossings, and speed reductions as part of the Safe Routes to School and Safe Streets for All initiatives, with construction expected to begin in early 2026. Board member Ally Johnson discussed concerns about vehicle idling near schools and the need for better mapping of pickup and drop-off zones, with Leroy agreeing to look into these issues further.

- **Merge First & Last Mile Study:** Hanna Feldman presented a study done in April 2025 on pedestrian connectivity near the anticipated Center Place mobility hub, highlighting key issues such as unsafe pedestrian crossings, lack of sidewalks, and maintenance problems in both public and private spaces. The team identified several next steps, including coordinating with property owners to improve private spaces, investigating additional improvements for Center Place Drive, and conducting another first/last mile study for the neighborhood south of US 34. Hanna also noted that the Merge Project will address some connectivity issues, and the team plans to investigate further details about the mobility hub's design and connection to surrounding areas.
- **Farmers Market Discussion:** The group discussed a Farmers Market presence, and they agreed to aim for August 16, 2025, to attend the Farmers Market for community outreach.
- **CIP Report:** A report was provided to the board members but due to time no discussion was made.

6. New Business:

- Jim Reisberg mentioned SSA4 is still meeting and the police department involvement in audits and the need for consistent data collection methods.
